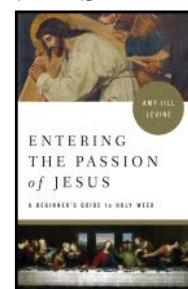

Teaching Moments: Epiphany

The liturgical season of Epiphany is significant in many Christian traditions. **It's not just a single day but a season that begins on January 6th and continues until Ash Wednesday** (the beginning of Lent)

Here are some key aspects:

1. **Celebration of Christ's Manifestation:** Epiphany celebrates the manifestation of Jesus Christ to the world, particularly to the Gentiles, as represented by the visit of the Magi. It's a time to reflect on the universal reach of Jesus' mission.
2. **Theme of Light:** The season emphasizes the theme of light, symbolizing Christ as the light of the world. Many churches incorporate special candlelight services and decorations to highlight this theme.

Groundhog Day and Epiphany

When Jesus spoke again to the people, he said, **“I am the light of the world. Whoever follows me will never walk in darkness, but will have the light of life.”** - John 8:12

February 2 is Groundhog Day. According to folklore, if it is cloudy (hence the groundhog does not see his shadow), spring-like weather will arrive early. If it is sunny (hence the groundhog sees his shadow), weather will be winter-like for at least six weeks. What is the origin of Groundhog Day? It is thought to have started in Germany from the legend that if the weather on Candlemas Day was sunny, six weeks of more winter-like weather were ahead, while if cloudy, not. From England, the poem: “If Candlemas be fair and bright, Winter has another flight. If Candlemas brings clouds and rain, Winter will not come again.” (Stormfax Weather Almanac. 2014.) Great, but what’s Candlemas Day?

Candlemas Day celebrates Jesus being presented at the temple (Luke 2:22-40) to be consecrated to God. Candlemas Day is the fortieth day after Christmas (counting Christmas Day as day one). You can check the calendar and see that if December 25 is day one then February 2 is day forty. As more Europeans became Christian, pagan celebrations with torches to mark the countdown to winter’s end became celebrations with candles to remind people that Christ is the light of the world. It’s appropriate, then, that Groundhog Day falls inside the church season of Epiphany. In Epiphany we remember the light of the star the Magi followed when they came to see and to bring gifts to Jesus. We also consider what it means in our lives that Jesus is light.

Take a flashlight out on a dark night. Walk around a bit. Turning around, you can use the flashlight to see what’s behind you. You can use the flashlight to see yourself, your hands, feet and body. You can use the flashlight to see what’s ahead of you. With Jesus as our Light we can see what’s behind us, whether it’s old sinful ways or struggles we survived. We can see who we are as we recall that Jesus died a tortuous death on a cross to save us from our sins, giving us better lives in this world and joyful eternal lives in the next. With Jesus as our light we can see the future as we consider the scripture’s words about Jesus coming again followed by God’s Kingdom coming in fullness. That happy ending can be yours if Jesus is your light. This light helps us and helps us share with others divine . . .

SUSANNAH'S FOOD PANTRY

People come to CUMC seeking immediate food assistance. We strive to extend Christ's helping hands. We hand out groceries to community members in need that come to the church. This act of faith ministry involves giving food to needy families, trusting that God will provide even more!

You can help by donating food.

We hand out **NON-PERISHABLE** (canned/boxed), **SIMPLE FOOD ITEMS**, such as spaghetti sauce, spaghetti noodles, mac-n-cheese, canned ham /chicken /tuna, beef stew or similar, soups, corn, green beans, fruit, peanut butter, jelly, side dish (noodles, rice, or potatoes), crackers, granola bars or similar, cereal.



We could use **canned meats** (*chicken, tuna, ham*), **canned fruits, jelly, and cereals or breakfast items**

For our "Side Pantry", we could use personal care items -- **shampoo, soap, tooth paste, tooth brushes**, etc.

With the colder months here, we could use new or gently used hats, **gloves**, scarfs.

Christ Church has recycling programs to help the environment. 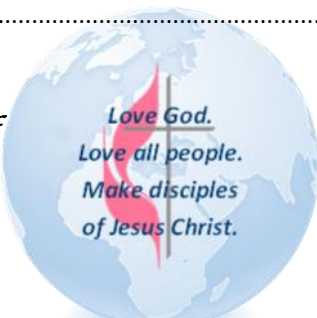
